FINAL ADOPTION: Ordinance No. 1136 - Repealing Section 1.08.010 of the Hobbs City Code and Enacting a New Section 1.08.010 Regarding Designation of City Districts

Ms. Jan Fletcher, City Clerk, presented a proposed ordinance stating Chapter 1.08 of the Hobbs Municipal Code requires adjustment of the City's districts every ten years following receipt of the Census data. She stated the proposed ordinance designates the six single-member Commission districts and a new district map outlining the districts streets, Plan H, as recommended by the Redistricting Committee. Ms. Fletcher stated Lea County will mail new voter ID cards for those voters who are in a new district.

Proper publication having been made, and there being no public comments or discussion, Commissioner Calderón moved to adopt Ordinance No. 1136 as presented. Commissioner Penick seconded the motion and roll call vote was recorded as follows: Smith yes, Fields yes, Calderón yes, Penick yes, Gerth yes, Cobb yes. The motion carried. A copy of the ordinance is attached and made a part of these minutes.

<u>FINAL ADOPTION: Ordinance No. 1137 - Amending Chapter 5.06 of the Hobbs</u> <u>Municipal Code for the Possession, Cultivation, Manufacture and Sale of Cannabis</u>

Ms. Valerie Chacon, Deputy City Attorney, stated on October 4, 2021, the City Commission adopted Ordinance No. 1133 - Cannabis Regulation Ordinance which sets forth the time, place and manner rules for cannabis establishments in Hobbs, New Mexico. She further stated the Cannabis Regulation Ordinance complies with NMSA 1978, Section 26-2C-1, and et seq. Ms. Chacon explained the details of the proposed ordinance which will amend Section 5.06.110 of the City's current Cannabis Regulation Ordinance by:

- Allowing Level 1 Producers (201-1,000 mature cannabis plants) to connect to City water services;
- Creating an appeal process for a producer to obtain a variance from the 10" water line requirement;
- Revising the appeal process to set forth evidentiary standards in an appeal.

 Revising the appeal process to create an appellate review standard before the City Commission.

In reply to Commissioner Gerth's question, Ms. Chacon stated the Legal Department did not receive calls regarding the proposed amendments to the Cannabis Regulation Ordinance but the Legal Department staff did make calls to business owners who are in the appeal process.

Proper publication having been made, and there being no public comments or further discussion, Commissioner Gerth moved to adopt Ordinance No. 1137 as presented. Commissioner Penick seconded the motion and roll call vote was recorded as follows: Smith yes, Fields yes, Calderón yes, Penick yes, Gerth yes, Cobb yes. The motion carried. A copy of the ordinance is attached and made a part of these minutes.

Resolution No. 7139 - Approving a Memorandum of Agreement Between Lea County and the City of Hobbs Regarding the Lea County Communications Authority (LCCA)

City Manager Manny Gomez stated on November 18, 2021, Lea County approved Resolution No. 21-NOV-264R approving a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the City of Hobbs regarding Lea County funding the cost of the Lea County Communication Authority (LCCA) dispatching for other Lea County Municipalities. Following approval by Lea County, the measure now comes to the City of Hobbs for consideration. He stated the MOA modifies the 2017 Joint Powers Agreement between Lea County and the City of Hobbs for establishing the LCCA. The terms of the MOA are as follows:

- Caps the City of Hobbs financial contribution for administrative and operations expenses of LCCA at \$1,500,000.00 annually (subject to CPI) or 50% of actual costs, whichever is less (III(H));
- Requires Lea County to enter into separate agreements for financial responsibility for the City of Lovington, the City of Eunice, and the Town of Tatum (III(G));
- Requires Lea County and the City of Hobbs to work to amend the 2017 JPA within 12 months (III(J));
- Requires that any "unilateral" decision affecting the LCCA by either the City of Hobbs or Lea County will be paid for by the implementing entity (III (H) and (I)).

City Manager Gomez introduced members of the LCCA Board present at the meeting as follows: Hobbs Fire Battalion Chief Kevin Shearer, Hobbs Police Chief John Ortolano and Lea County Manager Gallagher. Also present was LCCA Director Angela Martinez. He explained the municipalities joining LCCA will be non-voting members.

Commissioner Fields moved to approve Resolution No. 7139 as presented. Commissioner Penick seconded the motion and the vote was recorded as follows: Smith yes, Fields yes, Calderón yes, Penick yes, Gerth yes, Cobb yes. The motion carried. A

copy of the resolution and supporting documentation are attached and made a part of these minutes.

<u>PUBLICATION: Proposed Ordinance Consenting to the Del Norte Heights Annexation of a Portion of Section 16, Township 18 South, Range 38 East, Containing Approximately 82 Acres</u>

Mr. Kevin Robinson, Development Director, explained the proposed ordinance and stated the Del Norte Heights Annexation consists of a portion of Section 16, Township 18 South, and Range 38 East area containing approximately 82 acres and is located north and northwest of the termination of Hermosa Street. He stated the annexation proposal was presented to the Planning Board at the November 16, 2021, meeting with Board's recommendation of approval to the Commission with a 4-0 vote. Mr. Robinson stated if the Commission authorizes publication of the proposed ordinance, final review and adoption of the ordinance would occur in January, 2022.

Mayor Cobb stated the annexation is part of the Master Plan process.

In response to Commissioner Fields' inquiry, Mayor Cobb stated the annexation is North of Del Norte Heights.

In reply to Commissioner Penick's question, Mr. Robinson stated there are 290 units sketched in the annexation plan.

There being no further discussion, Commissioner Smith moved to approve publication of the proposed ordinance. Commissioner Fields seconded the motion and the vote was recorded as follows: Smith yes, Fields yes, Penick yes, Calderón yes, Gerth yes, Cobb yes. The motion carried. A copy of the proposed ordinance is attached and made a part of these minutes.

Resolution No. 7140 – Determining that Certain Structures are Ruined, Damaged and Dilapidated, are a Menace to Public Comfort, Health and Safety and Requires Removal from the Municipality (1124 West Cain, 711 North Cochran, 1411 East Alameda, 1413 East Alameda, and 1415 East Alameda)

Ms. Chacon explained the resolution and stated in the City of Hobbs' continuing promotion of safety and clean-up efforts within city limits. She sated the Hobbs Community Services- Environmental Division has identified properties which present health, life and safety hazards, which warrant remediation. Ms. Chacon stated the properties recommended for condemnation on Attachment "A" are as follows:

1124 W. Cain 711 N. Cochran 1411, 1413 and 1415 E. Alameda In response to Commissioner Smith's question, Ms. Chacon stated the order of lien priority are as follows: 1) Federal; 2) State; and, 3) City liens.

Commissioner Penick moved to approve Resolution No. 7140 as presented. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion and the vote was recorded as follows: Smith yes, Fields yes, Penick yes, Calderón yes, Gerth yes, Cobb yes. The motion carried. Copies of the resolution and supporting documentation are attached and made a part of these minutes.

Resolution No. 7141 – Approving the Submission of a Grant Application for the Hobbs Fire Department with the Department of Homeland Security Assistance to Firefighters Grant Program

Fire Chief Barry Young explained the Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) and stated the grant was created to enhance the safety of the public and firefighters with respect to fire and related hazards by providing critically needed resources to equip and train personnel to recognized standards, enhance operational efficiencies, foster interoperability, and support community resilience. He further stated the objective of AFG is to enhance a fire department's ability to protect the health and safety of the public, as well as that of first responder personnel. Fire Chief Young stated the Hobbs Fire Department wishes to utilize this opportunity to apply for funding for the purchase of cardiac monitors. He stated the grant will enhance the ability to protect the public with seven ambulances in service and approximately 8,000 calls per year. Fire Chief Young also stated this grant is a very competitive process and Hobbs did not get awarded in 2020.

Commissioner Penick stated Fire Chief Young is the "Grant Master".

There being no further comments, Commissioner Fields moved to approve Resolution No. 7141 as presented. Commissioner Gerth seconded the motion and the vote was recorded as follows: Smith yes, Fields yes, Penick yes, Calderón yes, Gerth yes, Cobb yes. The motion carried. Copies of the resolution and supporting documentation are attached and made a part of these minutes.

COMMENTS BY CITY COMMISSIONERS, CITY MANAGER

Mayor Cobb stated the next regular Commission meeting will be held at 6:00 p.m. on December 20, 2021. He further stated he will not be in attendance at the Commission Meeting on December 20, 2021, as he will be traveling for his birthday and the Christmas Holiday.

City Manager Gomez thanked the Commission for allowing him to attend the New Mexico Municipal League (NMML) Winter Conference which had great sessions. He stated Mr. Toby Spears, Finance Director, presented the House Bill 6 (HB6) and made a great

presentation during the Conference. City Manager Gomez also stated he attended the following sessions:

- Federal Rescue Fund and,
- OSHA Vaccination Mandate

City Manager Gomez stated Mr. Efren Cortez, City Attorney, is the President of NMML's Attorney's Association.

Ms. Meagan Mooney, Communication Director, stated the 4th Annual Tree Lighting event was held on December 4th at the Shipp Street Plaza. She stated 2,000 plus attended the event but she will confirm with EAGLE IC. Ms. Mooney stated there were 16 vendors and 16 window decorating in the contest. She further stated Lea County Center of the Arts was the hub for the event. Ms. Mooney stated there were three times more participants and volunteers at this event than the last event held in 2019.

Mayor Cobb thanked Ms. Mooney for her leadership.

Commissioner Gerth stated City employees do not get enough pats on their backs for all they do for the community. The Commission applauded the employees for all they do in the community.

Commissioner Gerth announced his candidacy for re-election in District 6 for the Municipal Officers Election to be held on March 1, 2022.

Commissioner Calderón stated he reluctantly voted yes on the Cannabis Regulation Ordinance. He stated as an educator and he is against drugs and alcohol.

Commissioner Penick echoed Commissioner Gerth's comments regarding City employees and all their hard work. He also stated he agreed with Commissioner Calderón's comments regarding being against drugs. He stated he will treat Cannabis business owners as businesses.

Commissioner Penick stated the Christmas Parade was a great event. He stated it was nice to see positivity in the community. Commissioner Penick encouraged everyone to carry the Christmas spirt into the New Year.

Commissioner Smith stated today he heard five people say they loved the parade and the Tree Lighting Event.

Commissioner Calderón stated he will be 80 years young and announced his candidacy for re-election in District 4 for the Municipal Officers Election to be held on March 1, 2022.

Mayor Cobb stated Mr. Gary Don Reagan, a close friend, passed away on December 4th. He stated Mr. Reagan left big shoes to fill. Summary: On March 19, 2021, the New Mexico Legislature passed Senate Bill (SB) 49 which amended the Local Economic Development Act ("LEDA") (NMSA 1978, §§ 5-10-1 through 5-10-17), to allow for the utilization of public support for retail businesses throughout New Mexico. In 2003, the City of Hobbs adopted Ordinance No. 915, which created the City of Hobbs Economic Development Strategic Plan Ordinance. In light of the changes by SB 49, the City of Hobbs must amend its Economic Development Strategic Plan Ordinance to affirmatively state that cultural facilities and retail businesses constitute qualifying entities before any public support can be provided to these entities. The current proposed ordinance:

- Amends Section 3.10.040 to state that cultural facilities and retail businesses constitute qualifying businesses:
- Amends the term "assets" to "public support" in compliance with NMSA 1978, § 5-10-3(K).

Pursuant to NMSA 1978, § 3-17-3, this proposed ordinance was published on November 19, 2021. Pursuant to NMSA 1978, § 5-10-4(E), if this ordinance amendment is published and subsequently adopted, an election on the question will need to be held within seventy-five (75) days of adoption. The City's next municipal election is set for March 1, 2022.

If the Ordinance is approved by the voters, the City Commission may create a local economic development fund through the annual budgeting process and may expend no more than ten percent (10%) of the annual general fund expenditures of the City of Hobbs in a fiscal year for economic development projects. ORDINANCE NO. <u>1138</u>

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 3.10.040 OF THE HOBBS MUNICIPAL CODE AMENDING THE CITY'S ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT STRATEGIC PLAN ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, on March 19, 2021, the New Mexico Legislature passed Senate Bill (SB) 49 which amended the Local Economic Development Act ("LEDA") (NMSA 1978, §§ 5-10-1 through 5-10-17), to allow for the utilization of public support for cultural facilities and retail businesses as qualifying entities throughout New Mexico; and

WHEREAS, previously on November 3, 2003, the City of Hobbs City

Commission adopted Ordinance No. 915, which created the City of Hobbs Economic

Development Strategic Plan Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to NMSA 1978, §5-10-4(E) the City of Hobbs must have an election within seventy-five days of the date an ordinance is adopted on the question of approving cultural facilities or retail businesses as qualifying entities eligible to utilize revenue generated by Municipal Local Option Gross Receipts; and

WHEREAS, cultural facilities add to the rich history of Hobbs, New Mexico, and preserving, educating and promoting the arts and culture of Southeastern New Mexico and West Texas will serve to enhance the quality of life for all residents of Hobbs and the surrounding areas; and


