Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance

Commissioner Fields delivered the invocation and Commissioner Gerth led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Approval of Minutes

Mayor Cobb welcomed Representative Larry Scott and Senator Gay Kernan to the meeting. He thanked them for their capital project funding during the recent Legislative session and for their advocacy.

Mayor Cobb announced, for the record, that the Commission met in closed session on May 1, 2023, at 4:00 p.m. for discussion of pending litigation in which the City is or may become a participant. No action or vote was taken by the Commission.

Commissioner Calderón moved the minutes of the regular meeting of May 1, 2023, and the budget work session of May 1, 2023, be approved as written. Commissioner Gerth seconded the motion and the vote was recorded as follows: Smith yes, Penick yes, Calderón yes, Fields yes, Mills yes, Gerth yes, Cobb yes. The motion carried.

Proclamations and Awards of Merit

Mayor Cobb proclaimed Monday, May 15, 2023, as "SkillsUSA Day". He presented the proclamation to Mr. Zeke Kaney, Hobbs Municipal Schools Principal of the CTECH Facility, and members of the SkillsUSA Team.

Mayor Cobb proclaimed Saturday, May 20, 2023, as "Kids to Parks Day". He presented the proclamation to Mr. Bryan Wagner, City of Hobbs Parks and Open Spaces Director.

Mayor Cobb proclaimed the week of May 21 – 27, 2023, as "Emergency Medical Services Week". He presented the proclamation to Mr. Mark Doporto, Deputy Fire Chief, and Mr. Michael Prudencio, EMS Coordinator Battalion Chief.

Mr. Gomez reviewed highlights about the work of each employee. He expressed gratitude to each and every employee for their hard work and also thanked the employees' families for their contributions to the organization.

Public Comments

Ms. Kay Hannum, Chair of the Friends of the Library, stated the committee would be hosting a community meet-and-greet reception on May 22, 2022, to welcome Ms. Nicki Lawless, the new Library Director, to her position. She stated the reception will be held at the Hobbs Public Library from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m. and is open to the public to attend.

Mr. Richard Sanchez of Habitat for Humanity expressed thanks and appreciation to the City of Hobbs for its support of Habitat for Humanity in Hobbs. He stated many other Habitat organizations do not receive support from their municipalities like the organization in Hobbs.

Commissioner Penick thanked Mr. Sanchez for his leadership in Hobbs.

Ms. Jill Ashenfelter addressed several comments to the Commission in opposition to tonight's proposed ordinance opting in to local elections. She stated the voter I.D. requirement should first be removed from the Charter before moving forward. Ms. Ashenfelter stated there are problems with voter integrity and election ballots should be hand counted.

Mr. Nick Maxwell stated he is opposed to the resolution of support on tonight's consent agenda supporting Holtec International and the Eddy Lea Energy Alliance. He encouraged the Commission not to adopt the resolution.

Consent Agenda

Mayor Cobb explained the process for the consent agenda which is reserved for items which are routine when the agenda is lengthy. He stated any member of the Commission may request an item to be transferred to the regular agenda from the consent agenda without discussion or vote.

Commissioner Penick moved for approval of the following Consent Agenda item(s):

Resolution No. 7338 – Supporting Holtec International and the Eddy Lea Energy Alliance in Their Efforts to Pursue a Consolidated Interim Storage Facility in Lea County, New Mexico

Resolution No. 7339 — Authorizing a Memorandum of Agreement with the Hobbs Municipal Schools for the Grant of \$150,000.00 to be Used for the Construction of a Special Education Courtyard on the Hobbs High School Campus

Commissioner Calderón explained the resolution which authorizes the Mayor to execute a Memorandum of Agreement with the Hobbs Municipal Schools detailing the terms and responsibilities of each party regarding a fiscal contribution from the City of Hobbs to the Hobbs Municipal Schools in the amount of \$150,000.00 to go towards the construction of a special education courtyard on the HHS campus. He stated this fiscal contribution comes from his City discretionary funds and will revert to the City of Hobbs if not used by June 30, 2023. Commissioner Calderón urged support for the resolution and stated it was the idea of Hobbs High School Principal Alfredo Turrubiates.

There being no discussion, Commissioner Calderón moved that Resolution No. 7339 be adopted as presented. Commissioner Fields seconded the motion and the vote was recorded as follows: Smith yes, Penick yes, Calderón yes, Fields yes, Mills yes, Gerth yes, Cobb yes. The motion carried. Copies of the resolution and agreement are attached and made a part of these minutes.

FINAL ADOPTION: Ordinance No. 1152 – Authorizing the City of Hobbs to Opt In to Local Elections for the Election of Municipal Officers

Ms. Jan Fletcher, City Clerk, explained the proposed ordinance authorizing the City of Hobbs to opt in to local elections for the election of its municipal officers. She stated Mr. Keith Manes, Lea County Clerk, is present tonight related to this election item.

Ms. Fletcher stated this topic was first discussed at the Commission meeting held on April 3, 2023, and a proposed ordinance was brought before this Commission for consideration on April 17, 2023. At that time, the Commission voted to publish the ordinance with an adjustment to lengthen the terms of office for elected officials. Ms. Fletcher stated the ordinance was published on April 25, 2023, and is being presented tonight for final consideration by the Commission.

Ms. Fletcher explained the details of the ordinance. She stated it is administrative in nature and it authorizes the City to opt in to elections called "regular local elections" which are held in November of odd years — to be combined with other non-partisan elections for local governing body members such as school boards, NMJC and other special districts. Ms. Fletcher stated two of these elections have been held so far, in November 2019 and November 2021. These elections are administered statewide by the County Clerks. The Lea County Clerk is already conducting regular local elections in Lea County in November of odd years and tonight's action would simply add the City of Hobbs to this election process.

Ms. Fletcher stated because the date of the election would be changing from March of even-numbered years to November of odd-numbered years, one of the requirements is that the ordinance must include a provision adjusting the terms of office by shortening the term or lengthening the term of office. After discussion, the Commission voted on April 17, 2023, to advertise the ordinance and adjust the terms of office by lengthening the terms. This has been done statewide by other municipalities when moving through this opt-in process. Ms. Fletcher reviewed the terms of office as follows:

- Mayor, Districts 1, 2, 3 Terms ending in March of 2024 will be extended and now expire on December 31, 2025, with a new term beginning January 1, 2026.
- Districts 4, 5, 6 and Municipal Judge Terms ending in March of 2026 will be extended and now expire on December 31, 2027, with a new term beginning January 1, 2028.

Mr. Fletcher explained her thoughts behind the proposal which are related to the frequency of changing election laws, cost savings to the City for the County to administer the election, combining the elections to create uniformity of process and consistency for voters, and to ultimately increase voter turnout.

Ms. Fletcher stated if the Commission votes to approve this ordinance and opt in to the regular local election, the voter I.D. requirement contained in the City's Charter would no longer be enforceable. State law does not require voter I.D. to vote in any election and State law will supersede the provisions of the Charter. The regular local election will be administered by the County Clerk and will not be administered by the City.

Lastly, Ms. Fletcher noted the municipality can rescind the opt-in ordinance after two regular local elections. If municipal elections are reinstated and again administered by the City, the voter I.D. requirement in the City Charter would then resume and become enforceable for municipal elections.

In closing, Ms. Fletcher expressed appreciation to the Mayor and Commissioners for consideration of this ordinance. She stated the City Clerk's Office stands ready to support the Commission in its final decision.

In response to a question by Commissioner Smith, Mr. Manes stated a first-time voter who registered by mail is required to show an I.D. when voting for the first time.

Mayor Cobb stated there has been substantial State legislation related to elections. Mr. Manes stated one bill alone was 300 pages in length. Mayor Cobb stated there is a movement to enhance and make voting less restrictive. Mr. Manes stated when Legislative bills are adopted, he is bound and obligated to follow New Mexico State laws related to election. Mr. Manes stated he personally supports voter I.D. but it is not allowed under New Mexico State law.

In response to Commissioner Mills' question, Mr. Manes stated there is now a permanent absentee list for every election. He stated the County is mandated to have two drop boxes for absentee ballots, one of which will be located at the Courthouse in Lovington and the other will be located at the Lea County Annex on Bender Blvd. Mr. Manes stated video surveillance of the drop box areas along with other laws such as no campaigning, etc.

Commissioner Penick stated in 2014, it was voted overwhelmingly by the citizens of Hobbs to support voter photo I.D. and overturning their opinion is wrong.

Mr. Efren Cortez, City Attorney, reviewed voter I.D. cases of importance. In the ACLU of New Mexico vs Santillanes, a 2007 case, the Court held that the City of Albuquerque's charter amendment requiring voter I.D. violated the Fourteenth Amendment Equal Protection Clause. The next case, Crawford vs. Marion County Election Board, a 2008 Court case, held that Indiana's law requiring voter I.D. was constitutional in large part because Indiana provided a voter I.D. to the voter free of charge contemporaneously with their vote. In 2008, the Tenth Circuit overturned the Federal Court's ruling in the Santillanes case and held the City of Albuquerque's charter amendment requiring voter I.D. was constitutional. In 2020, the Tenth Circuit struck down a Kansas law that required proof of U.S. citizenship in order to register to vote in Fish vs. Schwab. Mr. Cortez stated there could be more litigation in the future regarding the legality of voter I.D. requirements.

In 2014, the citizens of Hobbs voted in favor of voter I.D. with 1,018 voting in favor and 292 voting against. Mr. Cortez reviewed the City's charter requirements of voter I.D. In the charter, the City actually defaults to the county to confirm if the voter is registered to determine eligibility.

Mr. Cortez reviewed the following New Mexico Statutes:

- NMSA 1978, § 1-22-3.1(B)
 Allows a municipality to "opt-in" to the Local Election Act by adoption of ordinance
- NMSA 1978, § 1-22-3.1(B)
 Ordinance must set forth whether terms of incumbents will be extended or shortened
- NMSA 1978, § 1-22-3.1(B)
 Allows a municipality to "opt-out" after the second regular local election under the Act

In response to Commissioner Smith's comment, it was clarified that the next two regular local elections would be held in 2025 and 2027.

Mr. Cortez explained the details of NMSA 1978, § 1-22-3.1(C) regarding voter I.D. requirements as they relate to regular local elections which have a specific place in the Local Election Act. He reviewed the content of the section which states a home rule municipality that pursuant to its charter is implementing a form of required voter identification that supersedes the provisions of NMSA 1978, § 1-1-24 shall not elect is municipal officers at the regular local election. He stated this section is the requirement to register to voter. Mr. Cortez stated the City is required to give the plain meaning to the Statute as written and it is assumed the intent of the legislation was to be written in this manner. It is clear that the County cannot be compelled to enforce voter I.D. laws.

In response to earlier comments regarding extending the terms of office, Mr. Cortez stated election deferral and extending terms of office has been challenged in State vs. Oliver in 2020 in a pro-active mandamus proceeding. The Supreme Court did find a portion of SB 407 was unconstitutional as terms of Judges, District Attorneys, County Officials, etc., set forth by the N. M. Constitution cannot be extended by a legislative body. Mr. Cortez noted that the City of Albuquerque has done the very thing proposed by the City of Hobbs. Albuquerque was the test case on the constitutionality of voter I.D as Albuquerque opted in and did not vote to repeal their voter I.D. Being pro-active in their approach, staff at the City of Albuquerque did bring forth a measure to repeal its voter I.D. and the measure died. Albuquerque still has their voter I.D. in its Charter and the County conducts their elections. This is the exact same process that Hobbs is proposing.

Mayor Cobb requested comments from the audience on the proposed ordinance.

Ms. Jill Ashenfelter stated she is opposed to the ordinance and does not feel voters would want to model Hobbs like Albuquerque. She recommended that the City continue doing its own elections.

Representative Larry Scott stated as with most pieces of legislation, this one has pluses and minuses. He stated he stands in support of the ordinance and stated his interest is parochial. Representative Scott stated all of the City Commission is familiar with the gross receipts tax issue the City is facing as a result of destination sourcing. He stated the City's Legislative team worked very hard to mitigate revenue shortfalls with legislation which made it all the way to the Governor's desk but was not signed. Representative Scott stated the team was very effective and in the interest of continuity, he stated he would like to see this body retain its seats until resolution of the HB6 issue.

Senator Gay Kernan echoed the comments of Representative Scott and stated progress is being made on HB6 tax issues and it is critical to keep these key individuals in place while the work continues. Senator Kernan stated she appreciated all of the good information provided tonight and the City will have an opportunity to look at this

matter again after two elections. She expressed confidence in the election process and with the County Clerk. Senator Kernan supported passage of the ordinance.

Mr. Nick Maxwell stated he does not support the ordinance. He stated the language is plainly written and the legislature gave thought to municipalities who have charters. Mr. Maxwell stated the City has no authority to hold its election in November and this is raw power to overtake the voters of Hobbs. Once the City votes away its sovereignty, it will not be able to conduct its elections again. He stated he is opposed to the ordinance and expressed disappointment in the Republican speakers tonight.

Commissioner Penick stated it is a pleasure to serve together with this group of individuals and the Commission has formed a cohesive team; however, he does not support extending the terms of office for the elected officials.

Commissioner Mills stated it has been a tough issue for him. He stated even if we leave the election as is with the City, voter I.D. will not be viable in New Mexico. He stated it is an ideological partisan issue.

Commissioner Fields stated he has thought long and hard on the issue. He expressed appreciation to Mr. Cortez for all of the information provided. Commissioner Fields stated it is important to make sure the City is compliant with State law.

There being no further discussion or public comment, and proper publication have been made, Commissioner Calderón moved that Ordinance No. 1152 be adopted as presented. Commissioner Fields seconded the motion and the vote was recorded as follows: Smith yes, Penick no, Calderón yes, Fields yes, Mills yes, Gerth yes, Cobb yes. The motion carried. A copy of the ordinance is attached and made a part of these minutes.

Commissioner Calderón left the meeting at 7:20 p.m.

Resolution No. 7340 – PUBLIC HEARING: Concerning the Application of GSA Pizza, LLC, d/b/a Pizza Inn, 1943 North Grimes, for the Issuance of a Restaurant Liquor License for the Sale of Beer and Wine

Ms. Valerie Chacon, Deputy City Attorney, stated the purpose of tonight's public hearing is to consider the application of GSA Pizza, LLC, d/b/a Pizza Inn, for a beer and wine license at 1943 North Grimes.

Ms. Chacon asked if anyone was present at the public hearing regarding the application. Mr. Brandon Acevedo and Mr. Ryan Ganaway stated they are present on behalf of GSA Pizza. No other parties were present to speak for or against the application.

Ms. Chacon stated the State of New Mexico Alcoholic Beverage Control has granted preliminary approval to the issuance of a Restaurant "A" License for the sale of beer and wine at Pizza Inn, 1943 North Grimes. She stated a public hearing must be held within 45 days of receipt of the application on whether or not the transfer of the proposed liquor license should be granted. She stated notice of the hearing was published in the Hobbs News Sun on April 9 and 16, 2023, as shown by the Affidavit of Publication on file.

Ms. Chacon stated the application can be denied for only three reasons which are as follows: (1) if the location is within 300 feet of a church or school, which is not applicable here; (2) if it is in violation of a zoning or other ordinance of the governing body, which is not applicable here; and (3) if the issuance would be detrimental to the public health, safety or morals of the residents of the local option district. Ms. Chacon further stated disapproval by the governing body on public health, safety or morals must be based on and supported by substantial evidence pertaining to the specific prospective transferee or locations and a copy of the record must be submitted to the Alcoholic Beverage Control. Mr. Acevedo testified that all the statements made by Ms. Chacon are true and correct to his knowledge.

There being no discussion, Commissioner Gerth moved that Resolution No. 7340 be adopted as presented. Commissioner Penick seconded the motion and the vote was recorded as follows: Smith yes, Penick yes, Fields yes, Mills yes, Gerth yes, Cobb yes. The motion carried. Copies of the resolution and supporting documentation are attached and made a part of these minutes.

Resolution No. 7341 – Consideration and Approval of the FY 2023-2024 Preliminary Budget

Mr. Toby Spears, Finance Director, stated a budget work session was held on May 1, 2023, to discuss the FY 24 preliminary budget. Pursuant to applicable State law, the preliminary budget must be approved and submitted to the Local Government Division of the New Mexico Department of Finance and Administration by June 1, 2023. Since the budget discussion, one change was made to increase the cost of living adjustment (COLA) for employees from 2% to 4%. Mr. Spears stated this proposed preliminary budget includes \$69,863,600 in proposed General Fund expenditures and \$141,501,454 in proposed expenditures for all funds. Revenues in the General Fund are projected at \$64,685,850 and total revenue projections for all funds are set at \$126,299,905. He stated the current projected general fund cash reserve is set at 34% with a preliminary ending cash balance for all funds of \$63,894,457.

In response to Mayor Cobb's question, Mr. Spears stated the City is required by State law to have 1/12th or 8.33% in reserve. With the anticipated flowback of unspent funds as of June 30, 2023, Mr. Spears projected the City will have 56% in its reserve fund.

There being no further discussion, Commissioner Penick moved that Resolution No. 7341 be adopted as presented. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion and the vote was recorded as follows: Smith yes, Penick yes, Fields yes, Mills yes, Gerth yes, Cobb yes. The motion carried. Copies of the resolution and supporting documentation are attached and made a part of these minutes.

Resolution No. 7342 – Approving Amended Fees at Rockwind Community Links Golf Course

First, Mayor Cobb congratulated Rockwind Community Links on the notification received by the City today that Rockwind will be hosting the National Junior College Golf Championship in May of 2024. He stated this will be a very prestigious event for Rockwind to host.

Mr. Doug McDaniel, Recreation Director, Mr. Ben Kirkes, Rockwind Community Links Golf Professional/General Manager, and Mr. Cameron Bergman, Rockwind Director of Instruction/Community Engagement, presented a proposal to the Commission for amended fees at Rockwind Community Links Golf Course.

Mr. McDaniel stated a fee survey was done and previously presented to the Commission for discussion on March 6, 2023. Mr. McDaniel stated fees were last approved in 2014 in advance of the golf course's grand opening in 2015. He stated the reputation of the Rockwind Community Links Golf Course has continued to grow throughout the State of New Mexico and the surrounding region. Operational and maintenance cost, cost of goods sold and personnel costs have all increased since 2015 and it is necessary to increase the fees at this time. Currently, Rockwind has a "one size fits all" green fee concept for all days of the week that the course is open. Staff recommended a new fee structure which would have separate greens fees for weekdays (Monday, Wednesday, Thursday) and weekends/holidays (Friday, Saturday, Sundays and holidays). The current and proposed fees are included in Exhibits A, B and C, copies of which are attached to these minutes. Staff estimates the amended fees will generate approximately \$100,000 in additional revenue, dependent upon the number of rounds played, cart fees, tournament fees, etc.

There being no further discussion, Commissioner Penick moved that Resolution No. 7342 be adopted as presented. Commissioner Smith seconded the motion and the vote was recorded as follows: Smith yes, Penick yes, Fields yes, Mills yes, Gerth yes, Cobb yes. The motion carried. Copies of the resolution, exhibits and supporting documentation are attached and made a part of these minutes.

Consideration of Approval of RFP No. 543-23 to Provide Quick Service Restaurant Operations at Rockwind Community Links to Kenny Kim and Joy Field

Mr. McDaniel explained RFP 543-23 to provide quick-service restaurant, food, beverage and catering services at Rockwind Community Links Golf Course. He stated one proposal was received and was deemed to be responsive by the Finance Department. Mr. McDaniel stated representatives of an Evaluation Committee from Administration, Communications, General Services, Recreation and the Parks and Open Spaces Departments reviewed and scored the proposal. The proposers, Mr. Kenny Kim and Ms. Joy Field, have a combined total of 41 years in restaurant, food truck and catering operations. He stated they have successfully managed locations in Hobbs, Lovington, Eunice and Ruidoso.

Mr. McDaniel explained the meaning of quick service operations and stated a limited menu of items will be offered. If the proposal is awarded by the Commission, a Professional Services Agreement will be drafted and brought back before the Commission for approval with anticipated operations at Rockwind beginning approximately July 1, 2023. He explained the initial term of the Professional Services Agreement will be for one year with three additional one-year terms available. The proposer has offered \$1,000.00 per month to the City plus 3% profit sharing for the initial year of operations.

There being no discussion, Commissioner Gerth moved that RFP 543-23 be awarded to Mr. Kenny Kim and Ms. Joy Field as recommended. Commissioner Mills seconded the motion and the vote was recorded as follows: Smith yes, Penick yes, Fields yes, Mills yes, Gerth yes, Cobb yes. The motion carried. Copies of the supporting documentation are attached and made a part of these minutes.

<u>Consideration of Approval of RFP No. 540-23 for West Bender Blvd. Improvements Project and Recommendation to Accept Proposal from Molzen-Corbin & Associates, Inc.</u>

Mr. Todd Randall, City Engineer, explained RFP 540-23 for the West Bender Blvd. Improvements Project. He further explained the RFP seeks professional engineering and professional surveying services to conduct right-of-way surveying, topographic surveying, utility surveying, drainage analysis and storm drain design, engineering design, and construction plans for the West Bender Blvd. Improvements Project.

Mr. Randall stated three proposals were received as follows:

Molzen-Corbin & Associates Pettigrew & Associates Stantec Consulting Services, Inc.

The Evaluation Committee has determined that Molzen-Corbin & Associates Inc. is the most qualified offeror. Mr. Randall stated the cost of the design fee is \$377,092.83 plus \$25,218.08 in New Mexico gross receipts tax for a total of \$402,210.91.

Commissioner Gerth stated he hated for a local vendor to miss out on the project. Mr. Randall explained that the proposal is qualification based. He also explained the RFP proposal process as compared to the cooperative purchasing process.

Commissioner Penick agreed with the comments of Commissioner Gerth.

In response to Commissioner Gerth's question, Mr. Randall stated Souder Miller & Associates helped draft the proposal which excludes them from submitting a proposal on the project. Mr. Randall added that Souder Miller was aware of this exclusion from the onset.

In further response to Commissioner Gerth's inquiry, Mayor Cobb stated the ultimate goal for West Bender is to have four lanes of traffic plus a center turn lane with drainage.

There being no further discussion, Commissioner Fields moved that RFP 543-20 be awarded to Molzen-Corbin & Associates for the West Bender Blvd. Improvement Project. Commissioner Penick seconded the motion and the vote was recorded as follows: Smith yes, Penick yes, Fields yes, Mills yes, Gerth yes, Cobb yes. The motion carried. Copies of the supporting documentation are attached and made a part of these minutes.

Comments by City Commissioners, City Manager

Mr. Gomez thanked staff for their presentations. He also made the following announcements:

- City water conservation period is May 15 through September 15 of each year.
- May 17, 2023, is the Officer Down Memorial Ceremony at 8:00 a.m. in the street in front of the Hobbs Police Department, 300 North Turner.
- Congratulations to Rockwind on hosting the 2024 NJCAA Golf Championship.
- National Track Tournament is May 18 20 at the New Mexico Junior College with over 100 schools and 800 athletes participating.
- City Offices will be closed on May 29, 2023, for the Memorial Day Holiday.
- COREfest will be held on June 3 to celebrate the 5th anniversary of the CORE.
- Welcome to the City's new Library Director, Ms. Nichole Lawless, from Pueblo, Colorado. Thank you to Bob Hamilton for his leadership and serving as Acting Library Director, and thanks to the staff at the Hobbs Public Library.

Commissioner Gerth stated the golfing amenities at Rockwind Community Links are amazing and well worth the fees. He stated the City should look at slight increases in the fees more frequently rather than waiting so long to address the need.

Commissioner Mills stated there will be emails and calls from people who are unhappy with his decision tonight on the voting issue but there are often no easy answers. He

said it is the real life of an elected official who make large sacrifices to be elected officials. Commissioner Mills stated he will be serving on the Judicial Nominating Committee and interviewing applications next week. Commissioner Mills also stated he has met with some business owners regarding retail theft ideas and a good conversation was held on the topic.

Commissioner Penick expressed appreciation to staff at Rockwind Community Links for the great course ratings. He also thanked Ms. Shelia Baker who wears many hats at the City. He also thanked the citizens for their open line of communication.

Commissioner Smith echoed the sentiments of the other Commissioners and stated it was a very tough decision tonight on the election issue. He, too, appreciated the comments from citizens. Commissioner Smith agreed with Representative Scott's comment that every issue has two sides and that's what democracy is about.

Commissioner Penick also thanked Mr. Toby Spears and Mr. Todd Randall for their hard work.

Mayor Cobb stated the City wants to do what is best for the community. He thanked everyone for their attendance at the meeting tonight.

Mayor Cobb wished Commissioner Penick a happy birthday and led everyone in singing happy birthday.

<u>Adjournment</u>

There being no further business or comments, Commissioner Smith moved that the meeting adjourn. Commissioner Penick seconded the motion and the vote was recorded as follows: Smith yes, Penick yes, Fields yes, Mills yes, Gerth yes, Cobb yes. The motion carried. The meeting adjourned at 8:05 p.m.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN LEA COUNTY, NEW MEXICO AND THE CITY OF HOBBS

This Memorandum of Agreement is made on the date of the signatures below by and between Lea County, New Mexico, (hereinafter "County") and the City of Hobbs (hereinafter "City").

PURPOSE

The purpose of this Memorandum of Agreement is to memorialize the terms and agreement, including changes thereto, between County and City regarding County's grant of \$50,000.00 for operational and capital expenditures for the Hobbs Animal Adoption Center.

WHEREAS, at its regular meeting October 20th, 2022, the Board of County Commissioners of Lea County approved the request of County Commissioner Rebecca Long to use a portion of her discretionary funds, up to \$50,000.00 as a grant to the City for operational and capital expenditures for the Hobbs Animal Adoption Center; and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to accept the funds for the operational and capital expenditures for the Hobbs Animal Adoption Center.

AGREEMENT

- 1. The County will provide a grant up to \$50,000.00 to the City.
- 2. The City will use the grant funds for the operational and capital expenditures for the Hobbs Animal Adoption Center.

SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY

County and City and their public employees (as defined in the New Mexico Tort Claims Act) do not waive sovereign immunity, do not waive any defense(s), and/or do not waive any limitation(s) pursuant to the New Mexico Tort Claims Act. No provision in this Memorandum of Agreement modifies and/or waives any provision of the New Mexico Tort Claims Act as it relates to County and City and their public employees.

LIABILITY

Each party agrees to bear liability and responsibility for the negligent, reckless or deliberate acts or omissions of their own officers and employees, as limited by the New Mexico Tort Claims Act.

THIRD PARTY BENEFICIARIES

It is specifically agreed between the parties executing the Memorandum of Agreement that it is not intended by any of the provisions of any part of the Memorandum of Agreement to create in the public or any member thereof, a third party beneficiary, or to authorize anyone not a party to the Memorandum of Agreement to maintain, pursuant to the provisions of the Memorandum of Agreement, a suit of any nature, including but not limited to suits alleging wrongful death, bodily and/or personal injury to person(s), damages to property(ies), and/or any cause of action.

INSURANCE

Both County and City shall maintain liability insurance or qualify as a self-insured entity, as required by law.

TERM

This Memorandum of Agreement shall continue in full force and effect, until the grant funds have been used or July 31, 2023, whichever occurs first.

SEVERABILITY

If any provision of this Memorandum of Agreement is found to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the remaining provisions will continue to be valid and enforceable. If a court finds that any provision of this Memorandum of Agreement is invalid or unenforceable, but that by limiting such provision it would become valid and enforceable, then such provision will be deemed to be written, construed, and enforced as so limited.

NO ORAL MODIFICATION

The forgoing constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties and may be modified only in writing signed by both Parties. Amendments and alterations to this Memorandum of Agreement after execution may only be made in writing signed by both parties.

GOVERNING LAW

This Memorandum of Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of New Mexico.

EFFECTIVE DATE

This Memorandum of Agreement shall be in full force and effect upon execution and approval of the parties hereto.

Summary: On August 1, 2016, the City Commission adopted Ordinance No. 1095, including section 10.04.050 which enacted a penalty assessment program and set forth fine amounts for certain traffic violations deemed "penalty assessment misdemeanors." Ordinance No. 1095 also included section 10.04.060 which adopted court fees of twenty-nine dollars (\$29) for adjudicated penalty assessments. During the 2023 regular session of the NM Legislature, the Legislature enacted House Bill (H.B.) 139 which eliminated the previously enacted and applied court fees of twenty-nine dollars (\$29). As a result, the proposed ordinance will also repeal the court fees outlined in section 10.04.060(A). The proposed ordinance will increase each penalty assessment (i.e. fine) by twenty-nine dollars (\$29) while eliminating the court fees of twenty-nine dollars (\$29). Additionally, a penalty assessment has been added for the parking of heavy trucks and trailers as outlined in section 10.05 as adopted via Ordinance No. 1150. Pursuant to NMSA 1978, § 3-17-3, the proposed title and subject matter of the proposed ordinance was published in the Hobbs News-Sun on May 7, 2023, and a copy of the proposed ordinance was available in the City Clerk's Office for inspection and public review

- C. The term "penalty assessment misdemeanor" does not include a violation that has caused or contributed to an accident resulting in injury or death to a person.
- D. When an alleged violator of a penalty assessment misdemeanor elects to accept a notice to appear in lieu of a notice of penalty assessment, a fine imposed upon later conviction shall not exceed the penalty assessment established for the particular penalty assessment misdemeanor and probation imposed upon a suspended or deferred sentence shall not exceed ninety (90) days.
- E. The penalty assessment for speeding in violation of Section 12-6-1.2(A)(4), regarding speeding in a construction or safety zone posted as a double fine zone, shall be twice the penalty assessment for speeding for the equivalent miles per hour over the speed limit set out under the adopted penalty assessment program contained herein.
- F. Nothing contained in this chapter is intended to diminish the Municipal Judge's authority to designate the specified offenses under the traffic ordinance to which fines may be accepted by the traffic violations bureau under Section 12-11-2 of the Uniform Traffic Ordinance.

10.04.060 Fees.

- A. As outlined in Section 12 12 1.3 of the Uniform Traffic Ordinance, and Section 1.16.020 of the Hobbs Municipal Code, any person convicted of violating any provision of the traffic ordinance shall be assessed the following fees in addition to the individual prescribed penalty for each violation:
- 1. A corrections fee of twenty dollars (\$20.00);
- 2. A judicial education fee of three dollars (\$3.00);
- 3. A court automation fee of six dollars (\$6.00).
- B. In addition to the fees outlined herein, aAny person convicted of violating any provision of the traffic ordinance shall be assessed a "penalty assessment fee" of ten dollars (\$10.00) which, upon collection, shall be deposited in a special fund in the municipal treasury for use by the municipality only for municipal jailer training; for the construction planning, construction, operation and maintenance of the municipal jail; for paying the costs of housing the municipality's prisoners in other detention facilities in the state; or complying with match or contribution requirements for the receipt of federal funds relating to jails. However, if the municipality has a balance in this special fund that is over the amount projected to be needed for the next fiscal year for the purposes set forth in this subsection, the municipality may transfer the unneeded balance to its general fund.
- GB. In addition to the fees outlined herein, and as outlined in Section 12-6-12.2(O) of Uniform Traffic Ordinance and Section 1.16.060 of the Hobbs Municipal Code, any person

convicted of driving a motor vehicle while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs in violation of 12-6-12.1(A), (B), (C), or (D) shall be assessed, in addition to any other fee or fine, the following fees:

- 1. A fee of eighty-five dollars (\$85.00) to defray the costs of chemical and other tests utilized to determine the influence of alcohol or drugs;
- 2. A fee of seventy-five dollars (\$75.00) to fund comprehensive community programs for the prevention of driving while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs or for other traffic safety purposes.

The municipality shall maintain these fees in separate funds and transfer the fees collected in this subsection to the administrative office of the courts for credit to the crime laboratory fund and the traffic safety fund. No reference to the State DWI provision (NMSA 1978, § 66-8-102) in Section 1.16.060 of the Hobbs Municipal Code shall operate to conflict with or override this provision.

- DC. As used in the Uniform Traffic Ordinance, "convicted" means the defendant has been found guilty of a criminal charge by the Municipal Judge, either after trial, a plea of guilty or a plea of nolo contendere, or has elected to pay the penalty assessment in lieu of trial.
- <u>ED</u>. All fees outlined herein shall be distributed as prescribed by law and outlined in the Uniform Traffic Ordinance, the Hobbs Municipal Code, and State Statutes.

MARKET RATE SINGLE FAMILY DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into on this 5th day of June 2023 by and between the City Of Hobbs, New Mexico, a municipal corporation (hereinafter "City"); and Stuard Homes LLC, 4915 W. Steel Driver Rd., Hobbs, NM 88240, (hereinafter "Developer") for the purpose of delivering Housing Developer Services to be provided to the City.

RECITALS:

- ** The City requires to contract with a Market Rate Single Family Development Company to deliver Single Family Market Rate Housing to the Citizens of Hobbs, New Mexico.
- ** Developer has submitted a proposal to the City to deliver the required Market Rate Single Family Housing, to be produced within 365 days of ratification of this agreement, within the Municipal Boundaries.
- ** Any outstanding Development Agreements between the Developer and the City of Hobbs concerning the production of Market Rate Single Family Housing shall become null and void upon the ratification of this agreement herewith.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City of Hobbs and Developer do hereby agree as follows:

A. Work To Be Performed.

- 1. The Developer shall furnish to the City its Professional Housing Developer Services for certain work regarding the Market Rate Single Family Housing. All single family structures completed under this agreement shall be located within the municipal boundaries and shall have received a certificate of occupancy after ratification of this agreement.
- 2. Developer shall furnish to City its professional Housing Developer Services as provided by this Agreement. The specific duties include the production and delivering to the public Market Rate Single Family Housing Units in Hobbs. Produced Units receiving an infrastructure incentive reimbursement shall not now or in the future be utilized in a pecuniary manner by renting, leasing, exchanging or bartering habitation privileges to the property for a period of no less than 30 days at a time.
- 3. Specific activities required are to develop privately owned real property in the City including designing, building and transferring to the public individual market rate single family housing units. The City's subsidy may include any or all of the following funding assistance from the City:

Incentives are available for installed *public municipal infrastructure* only, providing compliance with:

- a. Incentive not to exceed per square footage basis:
 - i. \$5.00 per sq. ft. north of Sanger
 - ii. \$10.00 per sq. ft. south of Sanger
 - iii. Calculation based on living area only
- b. Incentive not to exceed per unit basis:
 - i. \$5,000.00 per single family unit
 - ii. \$2,500.00 per multi-family unit
- c. Incentive not to exceed fair share per linear foot of infrastructure basis:
 - i. \$90.00 per lineal front footage of complete public infrastructure, and further broken down as follows:
 - 1. Water (\$12.50 / lf):

 a. Twelve dollars fifty cents (\$12.50) per equivalent front foot of lot to which water service is provided (8" minimum service single family & 10" minimum service for multifamily);

2. **Sewer** (\$17.50 / lf):

 a. Seventeen dollars fifty cents (\$17.50) per equivalent front foot of lot to which sewer service is provided (8" minimum service single family & 10" minimum service for multifamily);

3. Street (\$45/ If):

 a. Forty five dollars (\$45) per equivalent front foot of lot to which street is provided (built to Minor Residential standards as promulgated within the City of Hobbs Major Thoroughfare Plan);

4. Sidewalk.

 a. Fifteen (\$15) per equivalent front foot of lot to which sidewalk (includes driveway with ADA accessible path) is provided;

Based on quantities of required publicly owned infrastructure installed supporting the project, the City Engineer shall determine if the value of the infrastructure is adequate as an equal exchange of value for the amount of City subsidy contributed to the market rate single family housing unit. The City Engineer shall resolve any issues concerning value or extent of infrastructure and amount of square footage of constructed housing units. Specifically, the City Engineer will determine the value or unit costs of the publicly owned infrastructure according to any City of Hobbs Annual Pavement/Concrete/Utility Contracts or public infrastructure projects and estimates.

B. Payment For Services.

- 1) The City shall pay for said services at the rates agreed to and as specified above in the Infrastructure details, as shown herein. Payment will not be made by the City for any unit until a certificate of occupancy is issued, based on this Agreement.
- 2) The total compensation to be paid to the Developer during the term of this Agreement shall not exceed One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00), unless the Agreement is amended by the City Commission.
- 3) City subsidy shall be paid when each individual single family unit is complete and certificate of occupancy is issued, provided the certificate of occupancy for the unit is issued after ratification of this agreement. Payment will be made within fifteen (15) days following a written request from the Developer and upon City inspection of project completion.
- 4) Produced Units receiving an infrastructure incentive reimbursement shall not now or in the future be utilized in a pecuniary manner by renting, leasing, exchanging or bartering habitation privileges to the property for a period of no less than 30 days at a time. Such usage either now or in the future, for a period not to exceed 10 years from date of issuance of a C.O., shall require

Developer to return any incentive funds received for any unit thus utilized, upon demand by the City. Developer shall record a "Declaration of Restrictive Covenants", attached hereto as Exhibit 2, to restrict such usage and to notify parties involved in future conveyances.

C. Construction Requirements.

Construction shall be of energy-efficient design per New Mexico Energy Conservation Code 2009, utilizing either stucco or brick on the exterior of all buildings.

D. Assignment of Agreement.

This Section refers to assignability of this Agreement, and not to assignability of the Project to be developed for housing. Developer shall not assign or transfer any interest in this Agreement. Except that Developer is permitted, upon City approval, to assign its interest to a Partnership or Corporation in which the Developer is the principal party or to an affiliated company, working with the Developer on the Project. Subject to the foregoing provision, this Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the parties to this Agreement and their respective successors and assigns; provided that upon any assignment of this Agreement by either party, the other party shall not be released from any obligation under, or liability accruing pursuant to this Agreement. Consent shall not unreasonably be withheld by either party.

E. <u>Insurance Requirements and Hold Harmless Provision.</u>

- 1. Developer agrees to obtain and maintain appropriate insurance during the course of the development of market rate single family housing with the City of Hobbs, as follows, and shall indemnify and hold harmless City, its employees, agents, officers and officials from any and all claims, losses, causes of action, and/or liabilities resulting from the conduct, negligence, errors or omissions of Developer or any employee or agent of Developer while engaged in performing the services called for herein.
- 2. The Developer shall maintain insurance coverage for General Liability, Automobile Liability, Errors and Omissions Insurance, and Workers' Compensation, subject to review and approval of the City Attorney.

F. Governing Law and Provisions.

- 1. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of New Mexico. Jurisdiction and venue relating to any litigation or dispute arising out of this Agreement shall be in the District Court of Lea County, New Mexico, only. If any part of this contract shall be deemed in violation of the laws or Constitution of New Mexico, only such part thereof shall be thereby invalidated, and all other parts hereof shall remain valid and enforceable.
 - If any party is found by a court to have breached this Agreement, the breaching party agrees to pay all reasonable costs, attorney's fees and expenses that shall be made or incurred by another party in enforcing any covenant or provision of this Agreement, including the expenses of in house counsel.

G. Final Payment and Release of Claims.

- 1. Developer, upon final payment of all amounts due under this Agreement, releases the City and its officers and employees from all liabilities, claims and obligations whatsoever arising from or under this Agreement.
- 2. City, upon Developer's final completion of all work items and covenants required of the Developer under this Agreement, shall release the Developer from all liabilities, claims and obligations whatsoever arising from or under this Agreement, on the day that is ten (10) years following the date of the City's issuance of a final certificate of occupancy on the Project.

H. Amendments.

This Agreement shall not be altered, changed, or amended except by written instrument approved and executed by both parties hereto.

I. Breach.

- 1. The following events constitute a breach of this Agreement by Developer:
 - Developer's failure to perform or comply with any of the terms, conditions or provisions of this Agreement.
- 2. The following events constitute a breach of this Agreement by City:
 - a) City's failure to perform or comply with any of the terms, conditions or provisions of this Agreement, including making timely and appropriate payments to the Developer.

J. Remedies Upon Breach.

- 1. Any party may sue to collect any and all damages that may accrue by virtue of the breach of this Agreement.
- 2. If any party is found by a court to have breached this Agreement, the breaching party agrees to pay all reasonable costs, attorney's fees and expenses that shall be made or incurred by another party in enforcing any covenant or provision of this Agreement.

K. Termination.

This Agreement shall be terminated upon the completion of all tenants herein specified or 365 days from date of ratification whichever comes first. A request for infrastructure reimbursement, for a qualified unit produced within the terms of this agreement, received after the Termination Date of this agreement will not eligible for payment.

L. Notice.

All notices given pursuant to or in connection with this Agreement shall be made in writing and
